



Mosquito Control Internship

This is an exciting opportunity to gain a variety of knowledge, learn new skills, work outside during the summer and help your community. We are on the lookout for eager self-motivated individuals that want to join our team of fellow "Mosquito Detectives", in the pursuit to "FIGHT THE BITE!"Your job? Protect the citizens from the annoyance of mosquitoes and the diseases they carry. This is a perfect opportunity for individual's that want to further their education in the study of Agriculture, Biology or other applied sciences, this position would be a great resume builder as well as field experience with the possibilities to earn credits through your college internship program.

Duties Include: (the following duties require on-the-job-training)

- Survey the assigned area for mosquito larval sources and such as irrigated pastures, ditches, marshy areas, water troughs, storm drains, etc.
- Identify stage of mosquito larval development and determine treatment method.
- Keep accurate records of all field activities with district's data collection device.
- Operate truck, trailer, ATV, and hand spray equipment and follow all safety requirements.
- Assist drone pilot in application operations. (upon request)
- Assist in loading helicopter. (upon request)
- Respond to citizen services requests.
- Communicate effectively with the public.
- Adult mosquito collection, identification and preparation for (PCR) testing.
- Pick up and prepare dead birds for West Nile virus testing.
- Keep equipment and vehicles clean and ready for use.
- Operate Ultra Low Volume truck mounted (ULV) fogger during the evening hours.

Work Hours:

- Position starts at \$14.00 per hour, pay is increased to \$16.00 per hour, upon successful completion of the Oregon Public Pesticide Applicators and Pesticide Laws and Safety exams.
- Mosquito Control Technicians will work 10 hours a day, 4 days a week.
- May be required to work 2 to 3 hours overtime in the evening and/or on weekends.
- This is a seasonal/temporary internship (Varies from May through September)

Qualifications:

- Have a valid driver's license and be at least 18 year years old.
- Be able to work outside for extended periods during hot weather.
- Must be able to routinely pick up objects up to 30 pounds and occasionally up to 50 pounds.
- Be respectful to the public as well as fellow employees.
- Have good communication skills and follow directions.
